PEOPLE'S UNIVERSITY, BHOPAL AMENDMENT NOTIFICATION

No. R-578-CC-2011-XXXVIII— In exercise of the powers conferred by Sub-Section (1) of Section 28 of the Madhya Pradesh Niji Vishwavidyalaya (Sthapna Avam Sanchalan) Adiniyam, 2007 the State Government hereby makes the **AMENDMENT NOTIFICATION** of the People's University, Bhopal.

1. They shall come into force from the date of their publication.
2. In the Ordinances of People's University, Bhopal, the following additions / modifications/ deletions /substitutions, shall be as indicated therein:
3. Amendment in the Ordinance No. 8, **BACHELOR OF DENTAL SURGERY (B.D.S.):**
 - a. In Clause No. 7.0, Sub Clause No. 7.6 under the heading Fourth year shall be modified as under:
All the following subjects to be included in the annual pattern
 - 7.6.1 Orthodontics and Dentofacial orthopaedics
 - 7.6.2 Oral Medicine and Radiology
 - 7.6.3 Pedodontia and Preventive Dentistry
 - 7.6.4 Periodontology
 - 7.6.5 Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery
 - 7.6.6 Prosthodontics and Crown & Bridge
 - 7.6.7 Conservative Dentistry and Endodontics
 - 7.6.8 Public Health Dentistry
 - b. In Clause 16.0, Sub Clause No. 16.1 shall be modified as follows :
The scheme of examination for BDS course shall be divided into 1st BDS professional examination at the end of the first academic year, 2nd BDS professional examination at the end of second year, 3rd BDS professional examination at the end of third year and, 4th BDS professional examination at the end of final year.
 - c. Sub clause 16.2 and 16.4.2 shall be deleted.
 - d. Sub clause 16.8 shall be substituted as under:
16.8 A single examination at the end of final year of the BDS course (annual pattern) with the following subjects:
 - 16.8.1- Oral Medicine and Radiology
 - 16.8.2- public health dentistry
 - 16.8.3- Orthodontics and dentofacial orthopaedics
 - 16.8.4- periodontology
 - 16.8.5- prosthodontics and crown and bridge
 - 16.8.6- conservative dentistry and endodontics
 - 16.8.7- Oral and maxillofacial surgery
 - 16.8.8- Pediatric and preventive dentistry
 - e. Sub clause 16.9 shall be deleted.
 - f. In Clause 17.0, Sub Clause No. 17.3 shall be substituted as follows :

The division of syllabus for question papers in the conjoint subjects of Physiology & Biochemistry; and, Pathology & Microbiology shall be as follows:

- 1. There shall be a single question paper consisting of two sections; A and B. Each section shall be allotted maximum marks of 35. Each section shall carry Long answer and short notes aggregating to 30 marks and 10 MCQs aggregating to 05 marks.***
- 2. For the subject of Physiology and Biochemistry, section A shall be assigned to Physiology and section B for Biochemistry.***
- 3. For the subject of Pathology and Microbiology, section A shall be assigned to Pathology and section B for Microbiology.***
- 4. Questions within each section shall be derived from respective subjects only.***

4. Amendment in the Ordinance No. 9, BACHELOR OF PHARMACY (B. PHARM):

- a. In Clause 2.0, under the heading COURSE STRUCTURE Sub Clauses :

2.2 shall be modified as '*Each semester shall be spread over for not less than 100 days*'.

2.3 shall be substituted as '*The duration for the completion of the program shall be fixed as double the actual duration of the program and the students have to pass within the said period, otherwise they have to get fresh Registration.*'

2.4 shall be modified as '*This ordinance shall apply to the programme and courses leading to the award of Degree of Bachelor of Pharmacy (B. Pharm.), based on semester based grading system from academic session 2017-18.*'

2.5 shall be deleted.

- b. In Clause 3.0 under the heading Academic Qualification & Selection Criteria for Admission, Sub Clauses No. 3.1, 3.3 shall be modified as follows :

3.1 The minimum qualification for admission to first semester of Bachelor of Pharmacy four year's (Eight semester) course shall be pass with minimum of 45% for General category and 40% for Reserved category marks obtained in 10+2 examination or any other equivalent examination with Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics or Biology conducted by State/Central Board of Secondary Education or any other board/university.

OR

The minimum qualification for admission to first semester of Bachelor of Pharmacy four year's (Eight semester) course shall be as per AICTE, New Delhi *or Any other qualification approved by the Pharmacy Council of India as equivalent to any of the above examinations.*

3.3 Lateral entry admissions shall be reserved for 10% of total seats for the students obtained Diploma in Pharmacy with minimum of 45% marks for general category and 40% marks for reserved category as per norms of regulatory authorities *and D. Pharm. course from an institution approved by the Pharmacy Council of India under section 12 of the Pharmacy Act. (As per PCI).*

- c. In Clause 4.0 under the heading Commencement of Course, Sub Clause No. 4.1 shall be substituted as follows :

The odd semesters shall be conducted from the month of June/July to November/December and the even semesters shall be conducted from December/January to May/June in every calendar year.

- d. In Clause 5.0 under the heading Regulations relating to assessment of academic growth of student shall be modified as under follows :

The assessment of academic growth of student shall be done on the basis of *continuous mode as well as sessional exams and one university exam /some Non university examination at the end of semester*. The medium of instruction and examination shall be English throughout the course of study.

Sub Clauses No. 5.1.1, 5.1.2, 5.1.3 shall be substituted as follows:

5.1.1 *The average marks of two Sessional exams shall be computed for internal assessment as per the requirements of marks distribution for individual semester scheme of examination*

5.1.2 Theory: *Sessional exam shall be conducted for 30 marks for theory and shall be computed for 15 marks.*

5.1.3 Practical: *Similarly Sessional exam for practical shall be conducted for 40 marks and shall be computed for 10 marks. Marks shall be awarded on the basis of the experiments performed by the students, prior preparation for the experiment, and conduct.*

Sub Clauses No. 5.1.4, 5.1.5, 5.1.6 shall be added as follows :

5.1.4 *A student shall be declared PASS and eligible for getting grade in a course of B.Pharm. program if he/she secures at least 50% marks in that particular course including internal assessment. For example, to be declared as PASS and to get grade, the student has to secure a minimum of 50 marks for the total of 100 including continuous mode of assessment and end semester theory examination and has to secure a minimum of 25 marks for the total 50 including internal assessment and end semester practical examination.*

5.1.5 *In case a student fails to secure the minimum 50% in any Theory or Practical course as specified in 5.1.4, then he/she shall reappear for the end semester examination of that course. However his/her marks of the Internal Assessment shall be carried over and he/she shall be entitled for grade obtained by him/her on passing.*

5.1.6 *A student shall have the opportunity to improve his/her performance only once in the Sessional exam component of the internal assessment. The re-conduct of the Sessional exam shall be completed before the commencement of next end semester theory examinations.*

- e. In Clause 5.2, Sub Clause No. 5.2.3 shall be substituted as follows :

Re-examination of end semester examination shall be conducted as per the schedule give below in table. The exact dates of examinations shall be notified from time to time.

- f. In Clause 5.3, Sub Clauses No. 5.3.1, 5.3.2, 5.3.3 shall be substituted as follows :

5.3.1 Details for the promotion to the next semester shall be prescribed as per the new draft syllabus and scheme of the PCI and proposed by BOS/HOI and approved by Academic council.

5.3.2 Each theory paper and practical will be treated as separate subject/head for passing. A candidate who has admitted in B. Pharm first semester, his/her academic progression rules are applicable as per new draft syllabus prescribed by PCI.

5.3.3 *A student shall be eligible to carry forward all the courses of I, II and III semesters till the IV semester examinations. However, he/she shall not be eligible to attend the courses of V semester until all the courses of I and II semesters are successfully completed.

***A student shall be eligible to carry forward all the courses of III, IV and V semesters till the VI semester examinations. However, he/she shall not be eligible to attend the courses of VII semester until all the courses of I, II, III and IV semesters are successfully completed.**

***A student shall be eligible to carry forward all the courses of V, VI and VII semesters till the VIII semester examinations. However, he/she shall not be eligible to get the course completion certificate until all the courses of I, II, III, IV, V and VI semesters are successfully completed.**

***A student shall be eligible to get his/her CGPA upon successful completion of the courses of I to VIII semesters within the stipulated time period as per the norms.**

***A lateral entry student shall be eligible to carry forward all the courses of III, IV and V semesters till the VI semester examinations. However, he/she shall not be eligible to attend the courses of VII semester until all the courses of III and IV semesters are successfully completed.**

***A lateral entry student shall be eligible to carry forward all the courses of V, VI and VII semesters till the VIII semester examinations. However, he/she shall not be eligible to get the course completion certificate until all the courses of III, IV, V and VI semesters are successfully completed.**

***A lateral entry student shall be eligible to get his/her CGPA upon successful completion of the courses of III to VIII semesters within the stipulated time period as per the norms.**

***Any student who has given more than 4 chances for successful completion of I / III semester courses and more than 3 chances for successful completion of II / IV semester courses shall be permitted to attend V / VII semester classes ONLY during the subsequent academic year as the case may be. In simpler terms there shall NOT be any ODD BATCH for any semester.**

Note: Grade AB should be considered as failed and treated as one head for deciding academic progression. Such rules are also applicable for those students who fail to register for examination(s) of any course in any semester.

- g. Sub Clause No. 5.3.4 shall be deleted.

- h. In Clause 5.4, Sub Clause No. 5.4.1 shall be substituted as follows :

Grading of performances:

Based on the performances, each student shall be awarded a final letter grade at the end of the semester for each course. The letter grades and their corresponding grade points are given in table below:

Note: A learner who remains absent for any end semester examination shall be assigned a letter grade of AB and a corresponding grade point of zero. He/she should reappear for the said evaluation/examination in due course.

- i. Sub Clause No. 5.4.1.1 shall be deleted.
- j. Sub Clauses No. 5.4.2, 5.4.3 shall be substituted as follows :

5.4.2 The Semester grade point average (SGPA):

The performance of a student in a semester is indicated by a number called 'Semester Grade Point Average' (SGPA). The SGPA is the weighted average of the grade points obtained in all the courses by the student during the semester. For example, if a student takes five courses (Theory/Practical) in a semester with credits C1, C2, C3, C4 and C5 and the student's grade points in these courses are G1, G2, G3, G4 and G5, respectively, and then students' SGPA is equal to:

$$SGPA = \frac{C1G1 + C2G2 + C3G3 + C4G4 + C5G5}{C1 + C2 + C3 + C4 + C5}$$

The SGPA is calculated to two decimal points. It should be noted that, the SGPA for any semester shall take into consideration the F and ABS grade awarded in that semester. For example if a learner has a F or ABS grade in course 4, the SGPA shall then be computed as:

$$SGPA = \frac{C_1G_1 + C_2G_2 + C_3G_3 + C_4 * ZERO + C_5G_5}{C_1 + C_2 + C_3 + C_4 + C_5}$$

5.4.3 The CGPA is calculated with the SGPA of all the VIII semesters to two decimal points and is indicated in final grade report card/final transcript showing the grades of all VIII semesters and their courses. The CGPA shall reflect the failed status in case of F grade(s), till the course(s) is/are passed. When the course(s) is/are passed by obtaining a pass grade on subsequent examination(s) the CGPA shall only reflect the new grade and not the fail grades earned earlier. The CGPA is calculated as:

$$CGPA = \frac{C1S1 + C2S2 + C3S3 + C4S4 + C5S5 + C6S6 + C7S7 + C8S8}{C1 + C2 + C3 + C4 + C5 + C6 + C7 + C8}$$

where C1, C2, C3,.... is the total number of credits for semester I,II,III,.... and S1,S2, S3,....is the SGPA of semester I, II, III,....

- k. Sub Clause No. 5.4.4 shall be substituted as follows :
- 5.4.4.1-Distinction/Division shall be awarded, in the programmes, as per following criterion:-**

CGPA	Distinction/Division
CGPA of 7.50 and above	First Class with Distinction
CGPA of 6.00 to 7.49	First Division
CGPA of 5.00 to 5.99	Second Division

5.4.4.2 Award of Distinction/Division shall be made only on successful completion of the Programme.

5.4.4.3 AWARD OF RANKS

Ranks and Medals shall be awarded on the basis of final CGPA. However, candidates who fail in one or more courses during the B. Pharm program shall not be eligible for award of ranks. Moreover, the candidates should have completed the B. Pharm program in minimum prescribed number of years, (four years) for the award of Ranks.

l. Sub Clauses No. 5.4.5, 5.4.6.1, 5.4.6.2, 5.4.6.3, 5.4.7 shall be deleted.

m. In Clause 5.0, Sub Clauses No. 5.5, 5.6 shall be substituted as follows :

5.5 PRACTICE SCHOOL:

In the VII semester, every candidate shall undergo practice school for a period of 150 hours evenly distributed throughout the semester. The student shall opt any one of the domains for practice school declared by the program committee from time to time.

At the end of the practice school, every student shall submit a printed report (in triplicate) on the practice school he/she attended (not more than 25 pages). Along with the exams of semester VII, the report submitted by the student, knowledge and skills acquired by the student through practice school shall be evaluated by the subject experts at college level and grade point shall be awarded

5.6 All the students shall undertake a project under the supervision of a teacher and submit a report. The area of the project shall directly relate any one of the elective subject opted by the student in semester VIII. The project shall be carried out in group not exceeding 5 in number. The project report shall be submitted in triplicate (typed & bound copy not less than 25 pages). The internal and external examiner appointed by the University shall evaluate the project at the time of the Practical examinations of other semester(s).

n. Sub Clause No. 5.6.1 shall be deleted.

o. In Clause 5.7 under the heading Professional Training, Sub Clause No. 5.7.1 shall be substituted as follows :

INDUSTRIAL TRAINING (Desirable)

Every candidate shall be required to work for at least 150 hours spread over four weeks in a Pharmaceutical Industry/Hospital. It includes Production unit, Quality Control department, Quality Assurance department, Analytical laboratory, Chemical manufacturing unit, Pharmaceutical R&D, Hospital (Clinical Pharmacy), Clinical Research Organization, Community Pharmacy, etc. After the Semester – VI and before the commencement of Semester – VII, and shall submit satisfactory report of such work and certificate duly signed by the authority of training organization to the head of the institute.

p. In Clause 5.0, Sub Clause No. 5.8 shall be substituted as follows :

Details of subjects, credits, course curricula and scheme of examination for B.Pharm programme as per Prescribed by PCI and approved by academic council.

q. In Clause 5.9, Sub Clauses No. 5.9.1, 5.9.2 shall be substituted and 5.9.3 shall be added as follows :

5.9.1 A candidate is required to put in at least 80% attendance in individual courses considering theory and practical separately.

5.9.2 The candidate shall complete the prescribed course satisfactorily to be eligible to appear for the respective examinations.

5.9.3 The total theory lectures and practicals shall be conducted as per the draft rules and syllabus for the B. pharm.

r. In Clause 6.1, Sub Clause No. 6.1.1 shall be substituted as follows :

Theory:	Practicals:

NOTE: Sessional exam shall be conducted for 30 marks for theory and shall be computed for 15 marks. Similarly Sessional exam for practical shall be conducted for 40 marks and shall be computed for 10 marks.

s. In Clause 7.0, Sub Clause No. 7.3 shall be substituted as follows :

Question Paper Setter/Moderator/Head evaluator: Professor, Associate Professor and Assistant Professor (with teaching experience of not less than 3 years) working in any pharmacy institute conducting B. Pharm and /or M. Pharm course can be appointed as Question Paper Setter/Moderator/Head Evaluator for semester theory examinations.

t. In Clause 8.0, Sub Clauses No. 8.3, 8.4 shall be substituted as follows :

8.3 Retotaling shall be permitted in all the papers.

8.4 Revaluation shall be permitted in any two theory papers only.

u. Sub Clause No. 8.5 shall be deleted.

v. In Clause 9.0, Sub Clause No. 9.5 shall be added as follows :

Candidate who seeks readmission to the program after break of study has to get the approval from the university by paying a condonation fee. No condonation is allowed for the candidate who has more than 2 years of break up period and he/she has to rejoin the program by paying the required fees.

5. Amendment in the Ordinance No. 10, **BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING:**

- a. In Clause 6.0 under the heading Course Commencement, Sub Clause No. 6.1 shall be modified as follows:
The commencement Basic B.Sc. (N) 1st year shall be start *from 01st October* of every year.
- b. In Clause 7.0 under the heading Examination, shall be substituted as *per the recommendations of Indian Nursing Council.*
- c. In Clause 7.3 under the heading University Examination, Sub Clause No. 7.3.1 shall be modified as There shall be one Annual University Examination at the end of each academic year *in the month of August / September.*
- d. In Clause 7.5 under the heading Supplementary Examination, Sub Clause No. 7.5.1 shall be modified and 7.5.2 shall be substituted as follows :
7.5.1 There will be only one mid-session Supplementary Examination held by the University ordinarily held in the month of *February / March.* However those who fail in supplementary exam they will appear in main exam.

7.5.2 The number of attempts, for examination has been waived off. However to appear for final year examination, the candidate shall have cleared all the previous examination.

- e. In Clause 8.0 under the heading Criteria for Passing , Sub Clauses No. 8.6 shall be substituted and 8.7, 8.7.1, 8.7.2 shall be added as follows :
8.6 The number of attempts, for examination has been waived off. However to appear for final year examination, the candidate shall have cleared all the previous examination.

8.7 Condonation of deficiency in marks

8.7.1 The grace marks up to a maximum of five marks may be awarded at the discretion of the university to a student who has failed only in two papers but has passed in all other papers.

8.7.2 After condonation of marks the result of the concerned B. Sc. (N) University examination shall be declared as "Pass by condonation" or "Pass by grace".

- f. In Clause 10.0 under the heading Attendance, Sub Clause No. 10.3 shall be added as follows :
A candidate of any nursing programme even though she has passed with 80% attendance in the practical, principal should ensure the 100% attendance for practicals. Candidates mark sheet and degree certificate, course completion certificate to be withheld until requirements are met for such candidates.

6. Amendment in the Ordinance No. 15, BACHELOR OF HOTEL MANAGEMENT AND CATERING TECHNOLOGY (BHMCT):

- a. In Clause 2.0 under the heading Course structure, Sub Clause No. 2.4 shall be added as follows :
This ordinance shall apply to the programme and courses leading to the award of degree of bachelor in Hotel Management & Catering Technology (BHMCT) based on Semester based grading system.
- b. In Clause 3.0 under the heading Academic qualification & selection criteria for admission, Sub Clause No. 3.2 shall be substituted as follows :
Admissions shall be according to following criteria:
3.2.1 Merit prepared on the basis of qualifying examination/ interview or test conducted by University or an Agency on its behalf.

3.2.2 Last date for admission will be as notified by the University.

3.2.3 Admission of Foreign Nationals / NRI/ PIO shall be as per policy / rules as applicable.

- c. In Clause 5.0, Sub Clause No. 5.1 shall be modified and 5.1.1 shall be substituted as follows :

5.1 SCHEME OF EVALUATION:

5.1.1 Scheme of evaluation shall consist of following theory and practical examinations.

5.1.1.1 Theory examination:

<i>Mid-semester examination.</i>	<i>20%</i>
<i>University examination.</i>	<i>70%</i>

5.1.1.2 Practical Examination:

5.1.4 shall be deleted.

- d. In Clause 5.2 under the heading Semester/University Examination , Sub Clauses No. 5.2.2,5.2.4 shall be substituted as follows:

5.2.2 University examinations of odd semester shall be held normally in November-December and in that of even semester in May-June every year.

5.2.4 Students failing in Training Report in 6th semester& Project Report in 7th semester shall be required to resubmit concerned Report(s) & reappear in examination, seminar & viva-voce.

- e. In Clause 5, Sub Clause No. 5.4, 5.4.1, 5.4.2, 5.4.3, 5.4.4, 5.4.5,5.4.6 shall be substituted as follows:
5.4 HEAD OF PASSING & PASSING CRITERIA:

5.4.1 Heads of Passing and Passing Criterion shall be as Per Table A.

5.4.2 Table A:

5.4.3 Students failing to obtain minimum SGPA of 5.0 (i.e. C Grade) in a semester, inspite of passing in all courses/subjects in the Semester, may make up the same by appearing in University examinations in those Theory Papers, which they have passed but secured less than Grade Point 5.0.

5.4.4 PROMOTION CRITERION:

5.4.5 Student passing in each of the previous semester(s) shall be eligible for promotion to next semester. Those not fulfilling this criterion shall be allowed to keep the next term (ATKT), as per criteria at Table A, subject to Registration in previous semester. However they must pass all subjects, of each of the semesters, within eight years, from the day of commencement of the Programme, notified by the University.

5.4.6 shall be added as follows:

5.5.2 Award of Distinction/Division shall be made only on successful completion of the Programme.

- g. In Clause 5.5, Sub Clauses No. 5.5.3, 5.5.4 shall be added as follows:

5.5.3 For the purpose of award of Division, conversion from CGPA to an equivalent % shall be according to following formula.

% Score = CGPA x 10.
